Fire Safety in High-Rise Buildings

On February 21, Shannon from the City of Richmond Hill Fire Department gave a presentation on fire safety to over 50 residents.

Some key points:

- A fire could happen to you – the odds are thousands of times greater than winning the lottery;
- 85% of fires are preventable; and
- the No. 1 cause of fires is cooking.

The question of what to do in case of an alarm – whether to leave or stay – is entirely up to **you**; the FD declined to make a recommendation.

However, a couple of things should be noted:

- make a decision quickly and stick with it;
- if you choose to stay and if you **seal your apartment door** against smoke using duct tape and wet towels you would probably be safe for “30 to 60 minutes” by which time any fire should be under control; and in this case
- call 911 to let the Fire Department know where you are.

If a fire breaks out in your apartment:

- leave;
- **close your apartment door behind you**;
- pull the fire alarm – these are located by the emergency staircases; **and**
- call 911.

The Fire Department left behind two-page information sheets with valuable advice on fire prevention and what to do in case of a fire. Copies are available from the Management Office.

Safety Initiatives at Observatory II

It may be worth mentioning some of the things that the Corporation already undertakes with the aim of fire safety. These include: the dryer vent lint cleaning programme, smoke detector inspections, suite door closer inspections, maintaining a list of residents needing evacuation assistance, the Fire Safety Appendix to the Rules and Regulations, and safety systems maintenance conducted by Vital Safety, our safety contractor.
